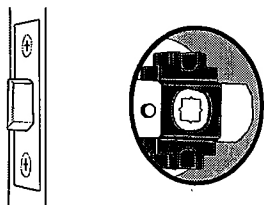


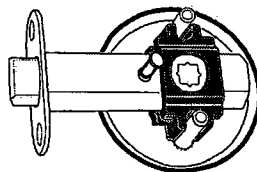
(a) Standard sizes of pre-drilled holes

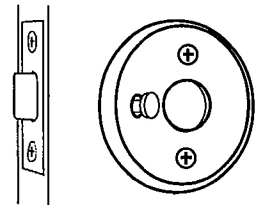

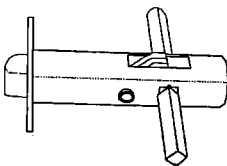
(b) Latch w/ face-plate + alignment pc



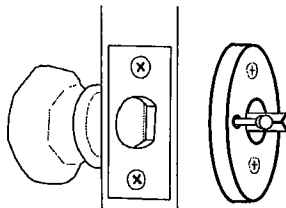
(c) Latch w/ alignment pc + privacy pin + 1 rose



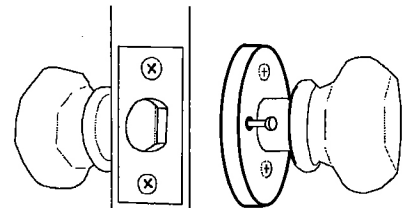
(d) Rose w/ privacy pin

Notes:

The latch is designed so the privacy function is released when door is closing (unless there is too much space between door and jamb). When the privacy function is activated from the inside, the outside doorknob will not open the door. Turning the inside doorknob will release the privacy pin and open the door. Or you can pull the privacy pin from inside the room.

Keep the Allen key. For considerations of the safety of small children, it is possible to insert a narrow bent object - like the enclosed Allen key, or a paper clip - through the privacy hole from the outside, and push the privacy lock mechanism to release it.
